Thank you for your interest in the Local Plan so far.

The Inspectors appointed to examine the Tonbridge and Malling Local Plan have requested that the Council conducts an additional consultation relating to material published since the submission of the Plan to the Secretary of State on 23rd January 2019 and how this has or has not affected the soundness, legal compliance and meeting the Duty to Cooperate of the Local Plan. The Council is therefore inviting comments, also known as representations on the soundness of the Local Plan, taking account of this additional material.

Focus of the representations

Given that the focus of the consultation is on the soundness of the Local Plan, responses should be framed by the tests of soundness for examining Local Plans as set out in para.182 in the Government's National Planning Policy Framework (March 2012), namely:

- **Positively prepared** the plan should be prepared based on a strategy which seeks to meet objectively assessed development and infrastructure requirements, including unmet requirements from neighbouring authorities where it is reasonable to do so and consistent with achieving sustainable development;
- Justified the plan should be the most appropriate strategy, when considered against the reasonable alternatives, based on proportionate evidence;
- **Effective** the plan should be deliverable over its period and based on effective joint working on cross-boundary strategic priorities; and
- **Consistent** with national policy the plan should enable the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in the Framework.

Representations that will not be accepted

The focus of this consultation is very clear. Any representations relating to other evidence base documents, or part(s) of the Local Plan that are unrelated to the documents being consulted on, will not be taken into account by the Examination Inspectors.
