Remember you are dust...

This year Valentine's Day, 14th February, also happens to correspond with Ash Wednesday. The day before is Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Day (or as it's called in some parts of the world, Fat Tuesday, Mardis Gras) when traditionally rich, fatty foods in the house were used up to prepare for the days of fasting to mark the season of Lent. Until the celebration of Easter Sunday people followed a limited diet and, even today, many give things up for Lent.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. In many churches there will be services which include the imposition of ashes. Ash, often made from old palm crosses, is used to mark the worshippers' foreheads with the sign of the cross and the words said at that moment are, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return". It is a time to reflect on our own mortality, the fact that we are, in the words of Joni Mitchell, 'stardust', with a limited time on the earth. At Ash Wednesday services we will also reflect on the fact that we are broken people living in a broken world. We get things wrong, we hurt ourselves, other people and the creation God gave us to look after.

So, is there anything, other than them being on the same day this year, that connects Ash Wednesday with St Valentine's Day, which is seen as a celebration of love?

It seems to me a remarkable thing that, even though we are 'dust' and even though we make a mess of things, God loves us. In fact the use of ashes to mark a cross on people's foreheads reminds us that God loves us so much that He came and died for us, carrying our sins with Him. There may be many expressions of love made this Valentine's Day, but none so great a love as that. It is the great mystery of God's love for humanity. As the writer of the Psalms puts it, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?".

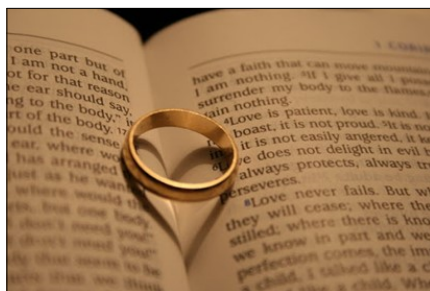

God, who crafted the heavens, the moon and the stars, loves each one of us, messy, dusty human beings. May you know that love for yourself this Valentine's Day.

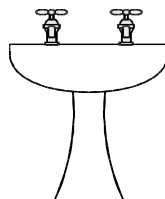

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council



ESTABLISHED
APRIL 1934

The Council met at 7.30pm Monday 8 January 2024.

Matters discussed and reports received included:

- **Climate Change** BGPC have been years ahead of the game on climate change which is why Potters Mede incorporates many innovative mitigation features and why we have an electric van. For 10 years we have also had a rolling programme of converting our 86 streetlights from the old power hungry Mercury and Sodium to LED; we have just approved the final conversions making us 100% LED. This will net us a 70% reduction in power costs, some £10k per annum, which we will use to fund solar power with battery storage at Potters Mede and are beginning a joint project with the Village Hall as well. Whilst Governments and big business dither and delay, it is down to us to tackle the problem.
- **Public Toilets** The Clerk has successfully negotiated a refund of £7800 from Npower overcharging on the toilet electricity supply. This will also be applied to our solar power project but in the future we hope the toilets will be powered by the Village Hall array.
- **TMBC Planning** The planning system has suffered significant problems with the new Agile software but is slowly being resolved and we are beginning to get regular notifications of applications - all posted as they arrive on the BGPC website at [PLANNING | mysite \(boroughgreen.gov.uk\)](https://planning.boroughgreen.gov.uk)
- **The Recreation Ground Pavilion** has been under threat from a dead tree for some months. Because this entire line of trees is protected by a Tree Preservation Order, we have had our fingers crossed whilst the owner awaited planning permission, which finally arrived, and the tree has been felled. This is a timely moment to remind other residents on the boundary with the Rec that all those trees are legally protected and you will be breaking the law if works are carried out without planning permission.
- **D-DAY 80 years 6 June** Plans are in hand for a community celebration on that Thursday, which will involve an extended lunch party for the elderly in the Village Hall, a gathering in the evening in the Rec to watch a Pipe Band, have a burger and a cuppa and a beacon lighting at 9.15pm. If anyone has ideas to add, contact Cllrs Sue Butterfill or Sam Thrush.
- **Julie Beilby** (a Borough Green girl) has retired as Chief Executive at TMBC after 40 years working for the Council. Her temporary replacement will be Adrian Stanfield, her Deputy, until a new CEO is recruited.
- **Jackie Taylor** has retired as Village Hall booking secretary after 12 years in this voluntary post. Bookings can now be made at bookings@boroughgreenvillagehall.co.uk and the phone number is **01732 646040**.
- **Council Vacancy** There is a vacancy on the Parish Council, apply to the Clerk. 
- **58 & 70 Shopper Buses** BGPC is applying for a Lottery Fund Grant on behalf of the Parish Alliance to run the two shopper bus services for a further year.

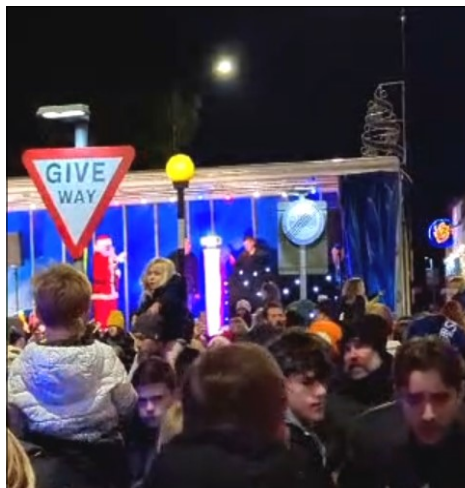

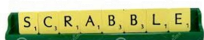

are part of the fastest growing type of waste in the UK today. Our Device Recycling Scheme aims to refurbish and reuse wherever possible in the local community. We use a specialist process to ensure 100% data-wiping, to the strictest UK legislative standards. Businesses or organisations will be provided with data erasure certification for auditing purposes.

To book a slot go to <https://devicerecyclingscheme.co.uk/> and Digital Kent will collect your equipment.

All collections are carried out using satellite-tracked vehicles, driven by Security Cleared drivers, so your discarded devices are safe and secure from the moment you dispose of them with us. Once your devices reach our partner's secure plant, it goes through a specialist data-wiping process, in line with the strictest UK legislative standards. When this is successfully completed, your device will then be refurbished and reused. If for any reason, your device fails to be 100% wiped, it will be destroyed and immediately shredded onsite, before being recycled in line with the WEEE directive, current UK legislation and our zero-landfill policy.



Charges for DIY Waste

You can now get rid of some of your DIY waste free of charge due to changes in government regulations. However there are limits on the frequency of your visits and the amount you can get rid of, as our household

waste recycling centres cannot accept all waste free of charge.

The limit includes:

- no more than 4 visits over a 4-week period with DIY waste
- 1 large item up to 200cm x 75cm in size (vehicle restrictions still apply) or
- 2 x 50-litre bags (standard black bag).

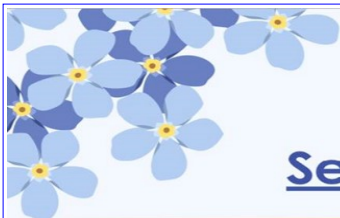

Training to boost borough's 'carbon literacy'

Local organisations which want to learn more about how to cut their carbon emissions are being invited to apply for funding to undertake specialist training. TMBC will help meet the cost of the courses which are being offered to small businesses, voluntary groups and parish and town councils.



The Carbon Literacy Training Grant scheme is designed to build understanding of sources of emissions linked to climate change and practical steps that can be taken to reduce them. Those completing the training will be certified as a carbon literate by the scheme's governing body, the Carbon Literacy Project.

Courses are available from a wide range of independent trainers and training organisations. Applicants will be able to shop around and choose an accredited course that is tailored to their particular sector. Applications can be made via <http://www.tmbc.gov.uk/carbonliteracy> and the closing date is **3 March**.

Shopfront and Vacant Unit Improvement Grant Scheme

This scheme is open to eligible businesses from across the Borough and applications would be welcomed particularly from four areas one of which is Borough Green High Street. Businesses can apply for a grant of up to 60% of eligible costs subject to a maximum of £5,000 towards the external renovation or improvement of ground floor and upper floor retail premises. For more information go to www.tmbc.gov.uk/business/shopfront-grant. The deadline for applications is **26 February**.

Training to break down barriers faced by socially excluded groups

TMBC have announced funding for three projects to help socially excluded groups overcome a range of challenges:

- a. to incentivise local employers to provide workplace experience for young people with special educational needs (SEN) and supporting those facing mental health challenges;
- b. to provide one-to-one support for people who are struggling to get a job because they lack literacy, numeracy or digital skills. Potential providers of training will be able to bid to provide help to a range of groups, including the over 50s, people with a disability, care leavers and victims of domestic abuse;
- c. to tackle digital exclusion by providing lap-tops and training to those who lack the skills and equipment to access employment opportunities.
